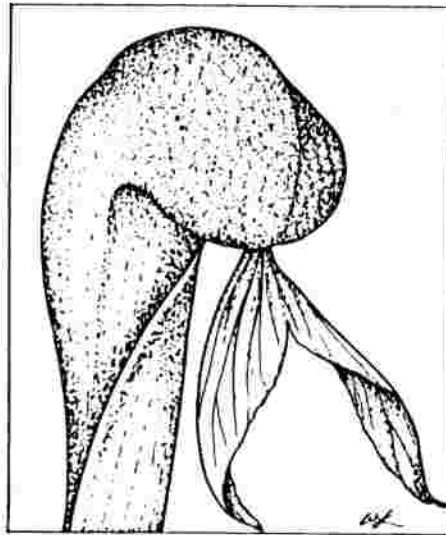

### Next Meeting

**Parking.** Judith Finn, our representative at the Botanical Garden, has arranged free parking for members attending the

meeting. Normally, public parking is \$1/hr. When you get to the Botanical Garden, drive into the permit parking lot. Obtain a day permit, to display in your car, from a BACPS representative who will be stationed in the lot from 11:45 to 12:30. If you arrive before or after this time or if the lot is full, drive (slowly!) to the greenhouse parking area. If you have things to bring to the meeting, first drive down to the meeting hall, unload your plants, and then park up in the greenhouse parking area.

**Program.** Bill Baumgartl will give an illustrated talk on some of his trips to the tepuis of Venezuela. The scenery is spectacular, and his pictures of *Heliamphora*, *Utricularia*, *Drosera*, and other plants will make your mouth water.

Please bring plants or other items for the following activities.

1. **Display.** Show off your specimen plants.
2. **Sale.** BACPS keeps 10% of the proceeds.
3. **Raffle.**
4. **Auction.** The seller keeps all proceeds except for a small auction fee, unless the item has been donated to BACPS. The auction fee is \$1 for every \$10 of sales price, rounded up to the nearest dollar. Sellers may specify 1) whether the plant is being donated to the society, and 2) minimum bid, if desired.

### S. F. County Fair Flower Show

In August every year we organize a judged CP competition at the San Francisco County Fair Flower Show. This is our major CP exhibition in the Bay Area, and it always turns out to be one of the major attractions at the Show.

We encourage all members to enter. First, second, and third prizes with monetary awards are given in each category. In addition, there are awards for "Best Australian Carnivorous Plant" and "Best in Show." You can't predict how tough your competition will be at any given show. So, if in doubt, enter your specimens and give the show a try. The size of our exhibit has grown each year. We hope to see a significant increase this year since the formation of BACPS.

You may deliver plants, planters, and terrariums on Wednesday evening, August 26. Special arrangements can be made if this time is impossible for you. Judging takes place on Thursday afternoon. The Show opens on Thursday night for a

preview audience and then to the general public from Friday through Sunday, August 28-30 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.. Owners pick up their plants after the show closes on Sunday evening.

Contact Tony Rea for entry forms, or pick one up at the August BACPS meeting. It is essential that Tony receive them by Monday, August 17, because the Flower Show Committee will refuse late entries. Keep in mind that you can withdraw an entry if something happens to your plant, but it is impossible to add anything after the deadline.

If you can spare some time, Tony can use help both setting up the display area on Sunday, August 23, and, especially, manning the exhibit during show hours. Also, if you have a television that you could lend for a few days, Tony would like to borrow it to run the video "Deathtrap" as part of our display. His television broke. 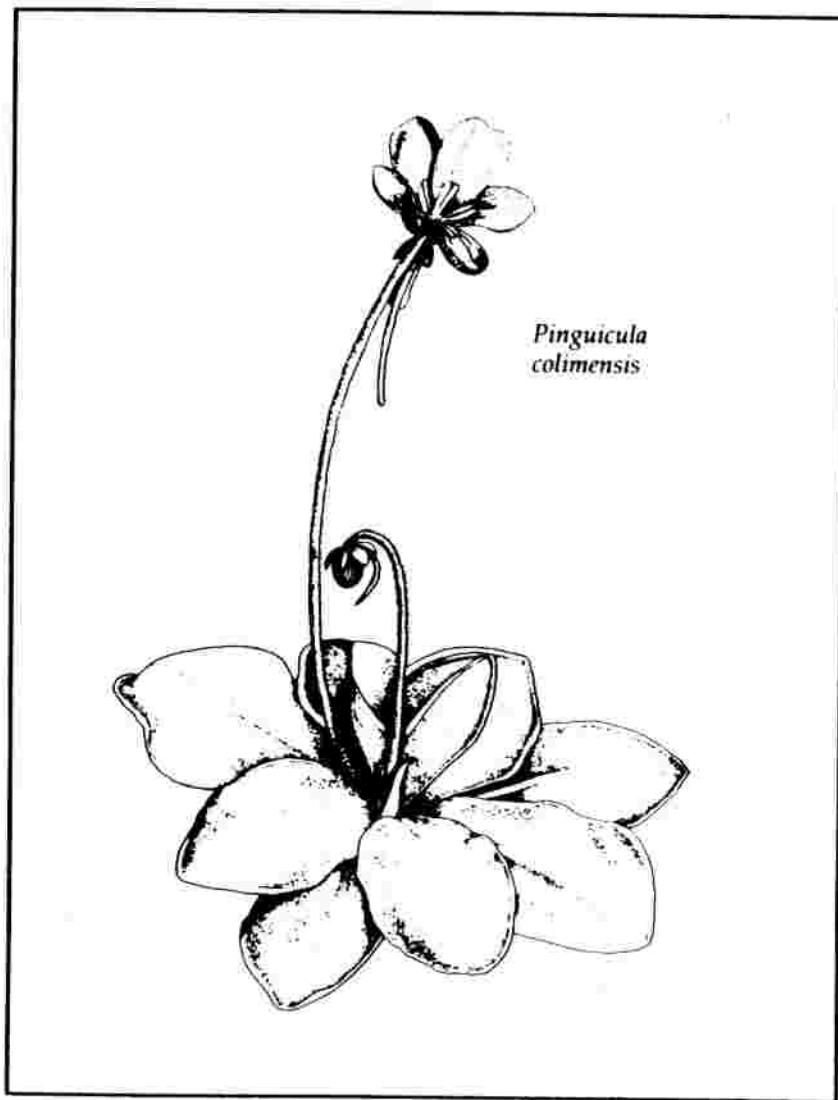
